### **Opening and Introductions**

- We did have a few new members today....Sergio, Erika, ?, ? (Perhaps the Chairs or Aaron can share their names for the notes as I did not record them, see Admissions Bike Tour Update bullet point)

### **Bike Share / Departmental Bikes update**

- Department Bike Update:

- The City of Fort Collins is giving CSU 20 red homogenous bikes for this purpose
- Central Receiving has hired someone to oversee the rental and maintenance of these department bikes
- Bike Share Update:
  - Zagster's stations are around \$9000.00 each
  - Two sponsors want to bring three stations to the perimeter of campus while Parking and Transportation Services will fund three internal stations
    - Aaron has a July 15<sup>th</sup> meeting with campus decision makers to get approval for sponsorship
    - If approved, the campus stations will be operable at the phase two August launch
  - Recycled Cycles will be doing the maintenance on these bikes
  - ASCSU will pursue a bike share fee next year to possibly add more stations
- Admissions Bike Tour Update:
  - Erika (?) with Admissions spoke to us about the three "To CSU" events that they have now incorporated bike tours into
  - They have seen a good amount of interest (100 out of 300 people said yes the first time they offered the tour)
  - Admissions is paying a monthly flat fee to Recycled Cycles so they can rent bikes at their leisure
  - Limiting the tour group to 12 people
  - Safe Cycling trained staff and student staff will be leading the rides
  - Admissions is still working out the scheduling but The Spoke has requested to know these days/times so they can make sure they are open during tours
  - Admissions is looking to hire a passionate student to take this program over

### **Bike shelter presentation from Urban Racks**

- Teresa Matthews with Urban Racks out of Seattle spoke to the CBAC about their covered parking options
- Urban Racks has been in the bike rack business for a decade, they work with Boulder currently
- Operation philosophy: Racks need to be convenient, hold up to weather challenges, be clearly visible and standardized.
- Large Bike shelter options: Comes in any color, vertical and/or horizontal racks, powder coated or galvanized steel posts, steel or polycarbonate roof, concrete pad dimensions given but the pad is not their responsibility to install and is not included in the cost, water run off included in the design, option to have the walls or no walls (Open Parkiteer Design).
  - CSU asked for a quote on is 16x30' configuration that holds 30-50 bikes that came out to be roughly \$15,000.00 to \$18,000.00
- 6 Bike Urban shelter:
  - Ranges from \$7,000.00 to 8,000.00
  - No snow load as the roof slopes
  - Clear or smoked window options with an aluminum frame
  - Can be as long as 27 feet in length

- Urban Racks does not install these shelters, our Facilities department would need to
- Double Rack stacker option
  - Expensive option for high density urban campuses, not best for CSU
- Seven Hanger Racks
  - Same style that we use
  - They manufacture theirs in China (ours are made in the USA) which seems to be a lower quality product
- They do not offer solar panels in any of their designs
