

Campus Bicycle Advisory Committee Meeting Notes 8/11/16

Opening and Instructions

- Kevin Waida, the ASCSU director of University Affairs attended the CBAC meeting for the first time

Pitkin low-stress network update- Aaron spoke to this point

- There will be a new signal at Springfield and Shields with a refuge onto a two-way cycle track that will transition from the sidewalk to the roadway
- Newton Sculpture Centerline Striping
 - CBAC looked at a design of dots vs hatch marks and voted on liking hatch marks the best
 - Jamie suggested we put in “slow zone” signage before entering into the Newton Sculpture area
 - The committee discussed using arrows and the Ram bike logo on the ground to show direction of travel
 - Rambassadors and PD bike patrol presence has been requested in this area

Bike to Breakfast Locations- Aaron spoke to this point

- Locations were discussed for the upcoming stations
 - University Center of the Arts, Pitkin St, South Dr by the contra flow, Plum and Meridian (3 will be decided on out of the 4 options discussed)
- Bret brought up doing a raffle for helmet wearers
- A Plug for CBAC volunteers was given

Covered Bike Parking Vendor- Aaron spoke to this point

- Ground Control Systems formally known as Park A Ride presented to the CBAC in our mission to adopt a standard, solar ready, large and modular covered bike parking shelter
- The Slope Shelter—This style of shelter has center posts to save space but does limit the rack placement
 - 9-foot span of coverage
 - Modular with a minimal roof profile with a transparent roof and solar options
 - This shelter has the potential to help with snow removal- a bonus!
 - CBAC Requested to have them mock up a drawing with our rack sizes

- A question was if they can add lighting for more safety with motion sensors
- Dero is presenting next month
- Wrap up in October with a report to Facilities through the Physical Development Committee

Bike Helmet Usage- Christina spoke to this point

- CSU Health Network has been collecting data for three years to look at trends
- This data shows an increase in helmet use

 - Bike safety week is the 3rd week in September
 - This is an enforcement and education event done by FCPS and CSUPD
 - An update on the Bike Education module was given
 - Jamie and Joy presented to the BAC on Monday 8/8/16 and gained a letter of support from that group
 - Ride Smart Drive Smart Program update
 - Positive rewards will be gifted by the ambassadors to people following the laws and riding safely
 - Zombie Smart Cycling update
 - October 22nd at CSU
 - 8-hour class
 - Helmets are required
 - Open Streets update
 - September 18th from 10am to 3pm
 - The route is from (old town square) from Linden St to Wilox Ln
- Christina Berg with The Health Network
 - Stated that the bike education module committee would benefit from coming up with a plan B for a non-mandatory module and that the Health Network website can host it
- Jake Drenth with Surplus and The Spoke
 - The Spoke is jointly managed by Jake Drenth and Heather Reimer now
 - The Spoke is open full time starting August 22nd (Mon-Friday 1-4:30pm)
- Heather Reimer with The Spoke
 - The Spoke is now supporting its educational goals with revenues from fixing campus fleet bikes (PD and Department bikes)

- Aaron Fodge reported that the bike cage at the Max University station has just been installed
 - Aaron shared pictures of bike rooms/parking from his recent visit to Portland
 - A large valet parking "lot" at the University costs \$150,000.00 a year to operate and is run by students
