Ride Report / Mode Split (Aaron B)

- Track your ride
- Automatically records, can tell if you’re biking vs driving, etc.
- Can integrate incentives, etc.- considering for campus/Citywide campaigns

Scope of Bike Economics Study (Annabelle Berklund)

- Presented study proposal for group feedback
- Economic and health impacts of increased bike infrastructure at CSU and along the Mason and Elizabeth travel sheds
- Perception of bike-ability and safety
- Consumer uptake and behavior
- Outputs: direct and indirect impacts

Game Day Bicycle Vision (Chris Ferris)

- Comprehensive transportation/parking plan in place, have been working on for 2 years
- Bike valet on Pitkin (W side of stadium), room for 280 bikes, including locker unit- bring own lock
- Planning for 5,000 bicycles on game day

- Question: can we re-evaluate after the first game to see if we have more than 5,000 bikes... consider adding more bike valet, etc.? (Joy) A from Chris: yes, we will watch and adjust to accommodate bikes
- All events with 10,000+ people are subject to homeland security regs (clear bags, no vehicles within 40 ft of stadium, etc.)
- How can we support making this a welcoming stadium for bicyclists? (AB)
A from Chris: Communication; make sure people know what to expect – thorough, effective, redundant. Then evaluate what we can do differently. What worked well vs. not?
- 200+ Rambassador volunteers to notify people about general policies as people approach stadium
- Have polled for 2 years to anticipate transportation behavior
- Ask of this group: work together to figure out how to improve if we find that we need to
- CBAC will include in September agenda to collect feedback

Game Day Bicycle Safety (Joy)

- Homeland security audit findings:
 - No bikes parked within 40 feet of stadium
 - Looking at moving bike racks located within that boundary, otherwise will need to impound all bikes left at racks on Fridays prior and make sure people don't park bikes there on game day
