

CBAC Meeting minutes for 3/10/16

11:30 Opening and Introductions

11:35 Bret shared an update on the Choose CSU March Bike Tour Recap

- March 4th tour was led by Bret Ellis (LCI) and two students
- Good attendance with 12 attendees (There were some no-shows but more people not on the list showed up)
- However, there were no bikes for the students due to a mix up at The Bike Library
- It was determined that talking points need to be established for the locations the tour stops along the route
- The next bike tour is scheduled for April 2nd, the lead LCI is still to be determined

11:50 Dave shared on the construction updates

- The underpass on Prospect is progressing on schedule and will be open in July 2016
- Prospect at Whitcomb will have a road closure in June for the installation of a sewer pipe
- The biology building project will begin installing steel next week
- The parking garage is progressing on schedule and will be open in late July of 2016
- Whitcomb will hopefully be updated with a buffered bike lane on the east side

12:00 Aaron quickly spoke to the Pitkin/Newton dismount zone access

- It was suggested that we observe this location before the next CBAC meeting to come with our ideas to make this a thru way for bikes to cross the dismount zone
- Ed suggested we install a mirror for visibility/safety
- A “stop light” idea was suggested to deal with high traffic times. The red color would signal the cyclist to dismount the bike and walk
- Minnesota University has a successful dismount zone pass thru for possible inspiration

12:05 Aaron/Jamie shared on the Bike Share/ Bike Library Bikes

- Zagster is the company that the City will lease the bike share stations from
- There are sponsors identified for half of the stations, the city will be paying for the other stations. CSU stations potentially could be funded by ASCSU.
- There will be a ribbon cutting ceremony on the launch date of April 1st from noon to 1pm at the Downtown Transit center

12:15 Aaron shared about the summer rack purchase

- The plan is to buy 8 to 10 racks this summer
- The goal is to reach 18,000 bike parking spaces in the next couple of years

12:20 Aaron showed a rendering of the proposed bike center

- The space would ideally be located on or near the Pitkin low stress bike network

12:25 Bret began the conversation of the CBAC 2016 Goal Review

- Wayfinding was recommended as a goal of the CBAC
- The goals that were identified in January's meeting were disused and some were assigned to individuals
 - David and Aaron will continue to a part of the Game Day Operation Plan and the development of covered bike parking standards
