Roundtable Updates:

- Laura Smith (Bike Fort Collins): Tour de Pi(e) ride today, March 14th
- Aaron Fodge (CSU Parking and Transportation): working with City of FC on joint RFP for scooter company. Hopefully will get scooters on the ground by the beginning of July; perhaps in time for CRU.
- Proposed law change in State Legislature to allow e-scooters in bike lanes
- Christina Berg (CSU Health Network): students/colleagues at Health Network interested in getting involved; Erika will connect CBAC co-chairs and Christina
- Ashleigh Rose (CSU Police): got 2 new e-bikes in, one is currently getting the 360 degree lights installed; getting ready for International Mountain Bike Police Association (IMBPA) conference at the start of next month in Fort Worth
- Jamie Gaskill (FC Bikes): Has been doing Bicycle Friendly Driver classes for City Police; save the date for April 27 Bike Fix it Bonanza (CSU Station will be at Trial Gardens), several stations throughout the City; Bike Buddy program launching next month; new program "Borrow the Bike Ambassadors" launching in a couple of weeks; FC Natural Areas Open House on April 10th to weigh in on master plan for soft surface trails
- Sylvia Cranmer (CSU Housing and Dining): New Assistant Director of Sustainability for HDS has been hired, Mary from George Mason University
- David Hansen (CSU Facilities): Covered bike parking will be installed outside of Facilities, will include solar

BICYCLE FRIENDLY UNIVERSITY APPLICATION (Heather Reimer)

First of the Five 'E' groups in the BFU application sections: 'Encouragement' Roundtable group presentation

A few highlights from discussion:

- Currently don't have President or Board-led ride. Could we do a ride to "Meet Your BAC," invite President to attend; CBAC could lead a Community Ride
- Reached 51,000 people through the Athletics email list for our 'Bike to the Game' promotion
- Many more events to list this time compared to last
- On Equity question, we can't identify specific events targeting People of Color or LGBTQ populations; Alt Trans Team is trying to organize a diversity-themed ride for April

DESIGN FEEDBACK (David Hansen)

Proposed Modification for North-South Bikeway Network

Feedback for "Prairie Loop" trail widening outside of Shepardson through Monfort Quad.

Connection to Amy Van Dyken; Bike Plan proposes buffered contraflow

Will be closing Amy Van Dyken this summer for new water line, opportunity to re-stripe

David proposes moving parking out into the street and adding a Northbound contraflow lane on the West side of the street, buffered by parked cars; would allow bike to continue on from Monfort Quad without crossing in front of turning cars.

Some concerns about snow removal, wheelchair access (if the curbs are ever modified to aprons)

Signage for bikes entering Oval (probably Yield)

Parking on other side of bike lane will be a first on campus; will need education and enforcement to avoid having people park in the bike lane

In general, group agrees that this is a positive improvement, should proceed with seeking approval at Physical Development Committee.

PRESENTATION: "E-BIKES ON BIKE TRAILS" (Jamie Gaskill, FC Bikes)

City Council will vote whether or not to adopt pilot on March 19 for e-bikes

- Paved trails only
- Class 1 and 2 e-bikes only (both go up to 20 mph)

Many Colorado cities have already passed similar legislation

Extensive education, outreach and evaluation throughout the pilot. CSU Public Health students will assist with evaluation.

City has purchased 3 e-bikes, will do road show pop-ups for people to try
