Construction Updates (David)

- Reinstalled lighting in College underpass (now brighter, more like other underpasses)
- University Ave will have pavers installed, will start at plaza, all the way down to Amy Van Dyken

 Foothills Master Planning currently underway; including transit and bike access, conference center, more amenities

Covered Bike Parking Update (David)

- David presented options to CBAC about 6 months ago
- Ran pricing on sloped, open sides design
 - o ~70,000 per set of 3 units
 - Would take ~\$200k to cover the full library bank of racks
 - o Wind and snow (foundation and structure to handle) are most costly elements
 - Needs to be finalized with the Campus Physical Development Committee, will present this month
 - Hope to get a couple built this summer

- 2010-2017 Analysis, presented by Joy
- What can CBAC do?
 - Heather pursuing U-lock donation from manufacturer
 - Suggest "buy a bike, get a free U-lock" promotion at local bike stores
 - Rambassadors helping people lock bikes properly in beginning of year, especially during
 - Advertising in dining halls
 - Engagement through The Spoke
 - o Present with Residence Hall Association

Bike Share (Aaron F)

- City analyzed best places to put bike share stations based on population density, households without cars, key destinations
- Zagster system has now been up for two years
- Now evaluating how the system should evolve with new dockless technology
- Current stats:
 - o 5,966 all time riders
 - o 2.905 active members
 - o 11,580 all-time rentals
 - 6,348 rentals in 2017
- Ridership peaks in Summer
- Heavy on evening, weekend use
- 18% customers from Fort Collins, others from out of town and out of state
- Future: what do we want?
 - More bikes
 - Better serve students
- Think about for next month:
 - o Pay per trip vs membership?
 - o Geo-fence specific racks, or just designate academic spine?
